I just love "Jimmy Bell," a song delivered acapella except for harp and foot stomps. Speaking of acapella, "Saw Mill Holler" is another great tune, just Slim's soulful vocal, all by its lonesome. Serious blues. The disc ends with another gritty, slide laden, Southern soul blues, "Judge Harsh Blues."

The Wheel Man is one fine blues record, and one I will play time and time again.
