The Piedmont Blues Preservation serving Society, Greensboro / High Point / Winston-Salem areas, recently awarded their 2009 "Keepin' the Blues Alive" award to Ralph Speas. As archivist for the PBPS, Ralph's tireless devotion to filming blues concerts, Blues in the Schools perform-ances, and PBPS events has resulted in an impressive library of blues archives. Ralph has also been a past guest speaker at a BLUESunday for CBS, and more recently has taught his informative and historically relevant 'Learnin' The Blues' course at Guilford Technical Community College.

- Songs from the Road Jeff Healey Ruf Records has announced an early September release date for a new album featuring 11 previously unreleased live tracks from the late, uniquely gifted guitarist Jeff Healey. Songs from the Road is the follow-up to Mess of Blues, which was released just weeks after Jeff's untimely death from cancer at age 41 on March 2, 2008. Mess of Blues was honored at this year's Blues Music Awards as "Blues-Rock Album of the Year," the debut of that award category.
- Escape From the Chicken Coop Watermelon Slim Be on the lookout for this latest release from Watermelon Slim, scheduled for release in early August (Northern Blues label). Bill "Watermelon Slim" Homans has built a remarkable reputation with his raw, impassioned intensity. HARP Magazine wrote "From sizzling slide guitar...to nitty-gritty harp blowing...to a gruff, resonating Okie twang, Slim delivers acutely personal workingman blues with both hands on the wheel of life, a bottle of hooch in his pocket, and the Bible on the passenger seat." Paste Magazine writes "He's one hell of a bottleneck guitarist, and he's got that cry in his voice that only the greatest singers in the genre have had before him."
- Between a Rock and the Blues Joe Louis Walker Stony Plain Records has announced a late September release date for this latest album from multi-Grammy and Blues Music Award winner, Joe Louis Walker. The album features some of the nastiest guitar work Walker has recorded in his career, tearing into both electric and slide guitar, while aided and abetted by Kevin Eubanks' accompanying crunchy fretwork. Another guest on the album is Duke Robillard.
- Betsy came back from Ireland too soon! The Harvest Blues Festival in Monoghan, Ireland, will be held Sept. 4-6. The line-up includes many acts from the U.S. and various European countries - Coco Montoya, Harper, Nathan & the Zydeco Cha Chas, King Pleasure & the Biscuit Boys, Too Slim & the Tail Draggers, Bib Mamma's Door, and many more!
- "Virginia Rocks! The History of Rockabilly in the Commonwealth" This is a 2-CD set that includes more than 60 songs that draw their pulsing-with-life energy directly from the pure, unadulterated fountainhead of early rockabilly. Legendary Virginia singer Patsy Cline dabbled in rockabilly, as did Roy Clark and Wayne Newton. Songs by them are included in the set, but with these few exceptions, this is a tribute to obscure Virginia artists who could rock it up with the best of them. "I think the real importance of this project is the recognition and acknowledgement it gives to people from communities throughout Virginia who started out by imitating the music, and then went on to create their own."
